BY

- ✿ Investigating the current status of eGovernment research funding and management across Europe
- ✿ Identifying expected future needs in eGovernment research
- ✿ Proposing a systematic framework, a “handbook”, addressing the needs by
  - ✿ proposing policy actions and practices
  - ✿ holding up good practices

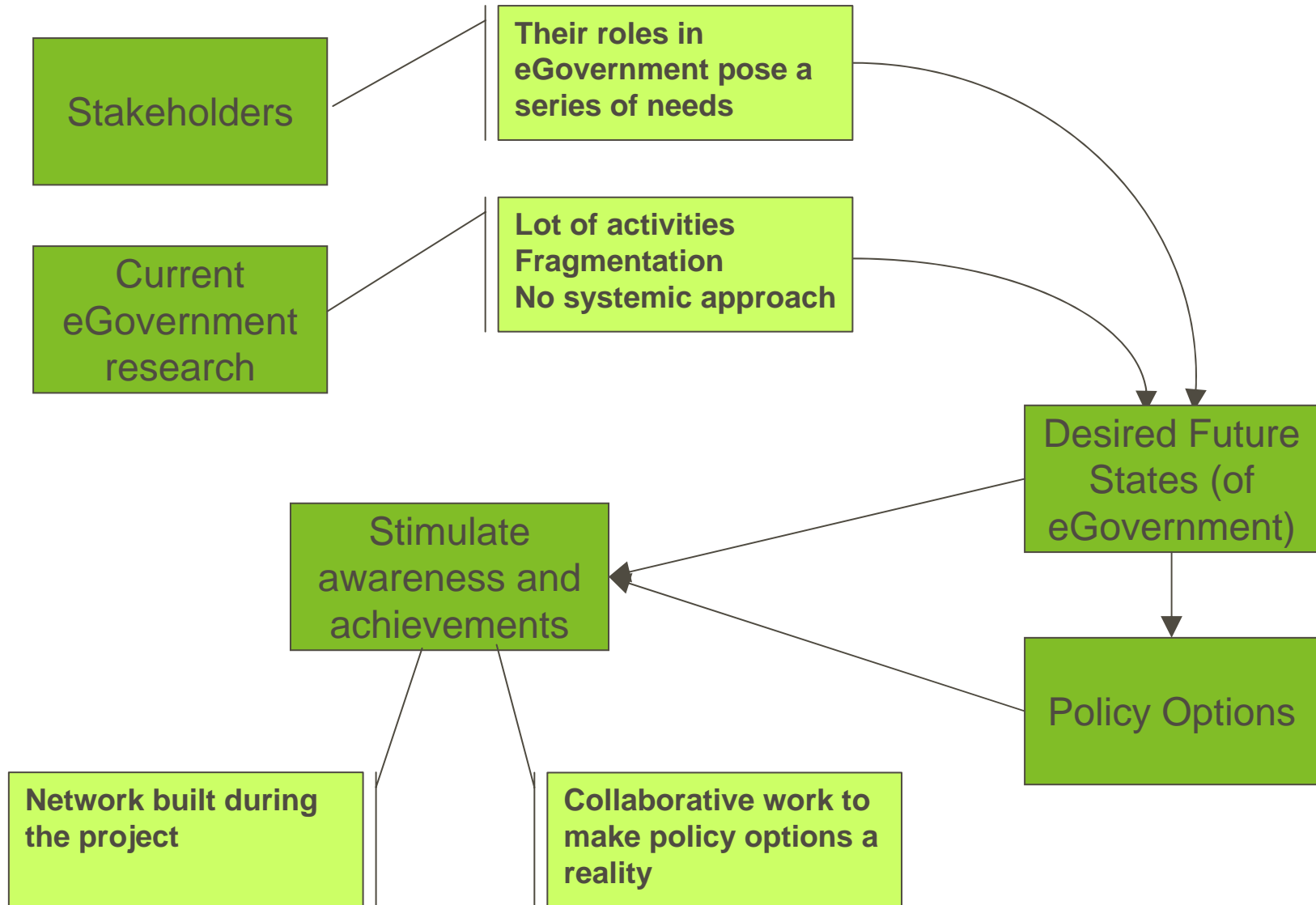
## What is 'the framework'?

- ✿ An organised and structured set of main eGOVERNMENT results
- ✿ A 'handbook' of good management of national and regional eGovernment research in Europe
- ✿ The framework is the base on which to build and future cooperation with high level commitment

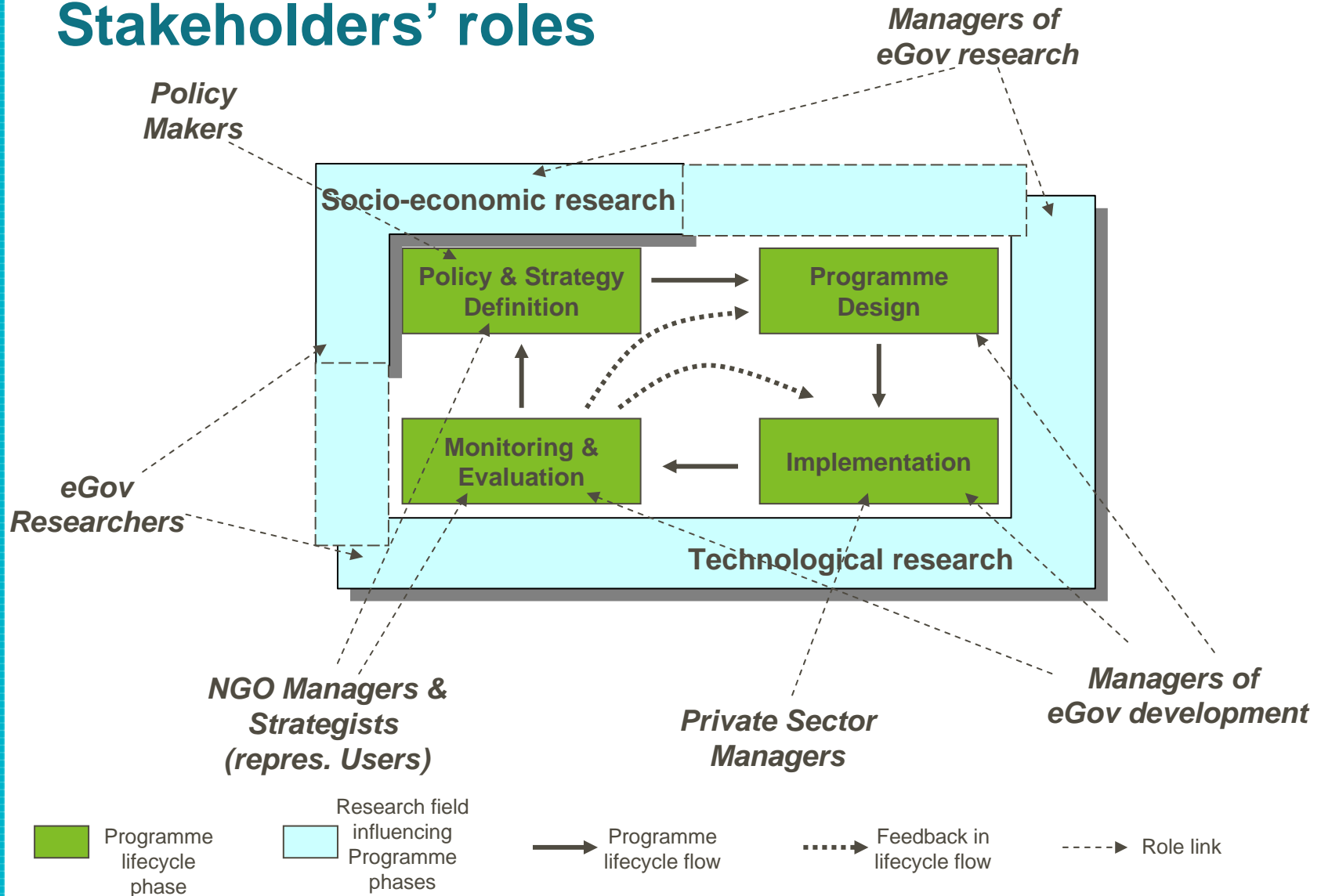

## Understanding Stakeholder's needs

- ✿ Classification of actors involved with respect to their roles at the eGovernment “arena”
- ✿ Looking at both dimensions of **implementation** and **research** in eGovernment
- ✿ Ultimate aim of the eGOVERNMENT work is:
  - ✿ to disseminate results
  - ✿ ensure take-up in planning and implementation of future eGovernment programmes and projects

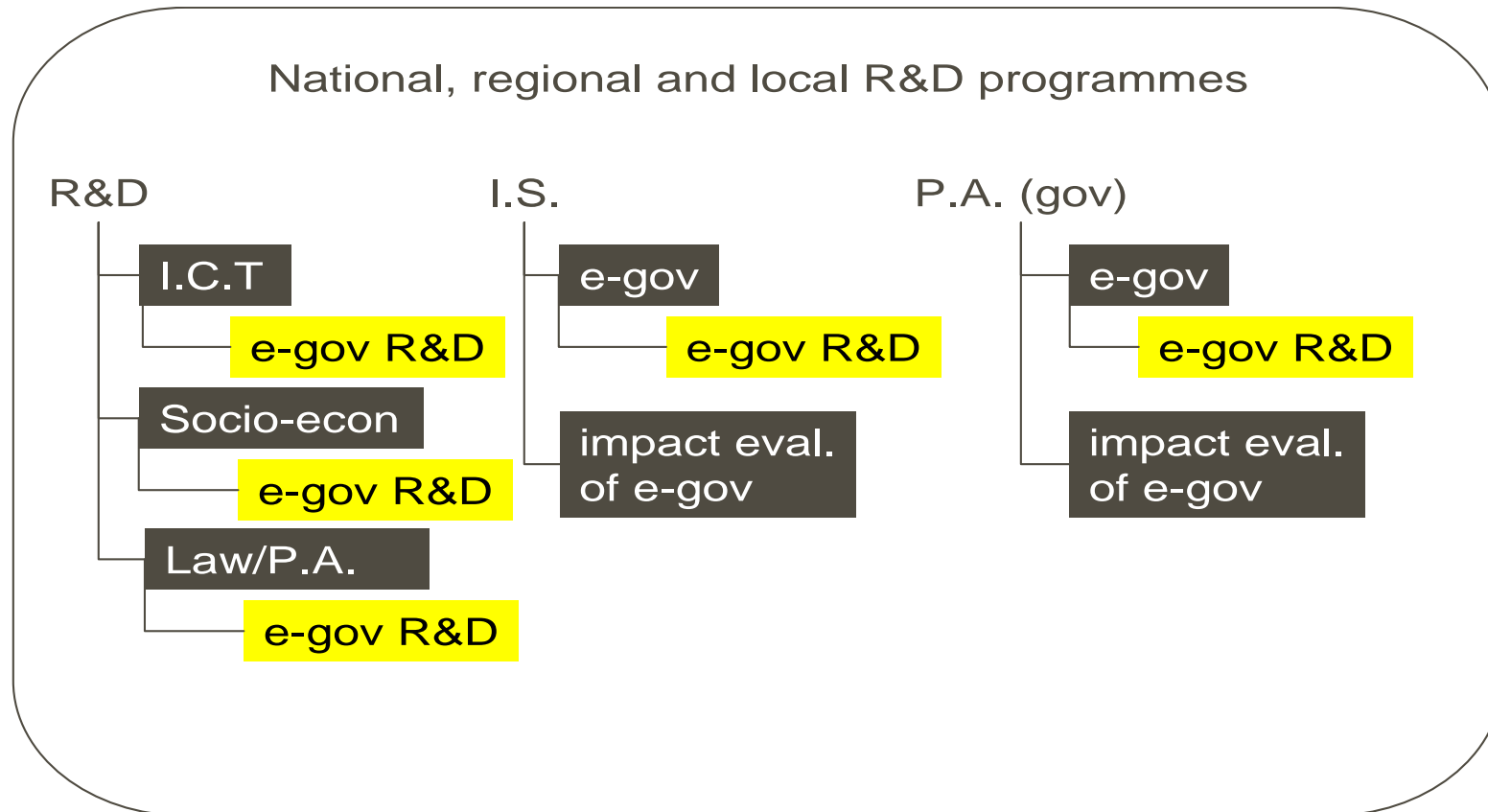
## Current status of eGovernment Research

Main findings:

- ✿ Classification of programmes (few programmes explicitly referring to eGovernment)
- ✿ Fragmentation is a reality (not necessarily a negative factor!), also at national level
- ✿ The bottleneck paradox
- ✿ Not clear identification of priorities



## Different settings for eGov Research

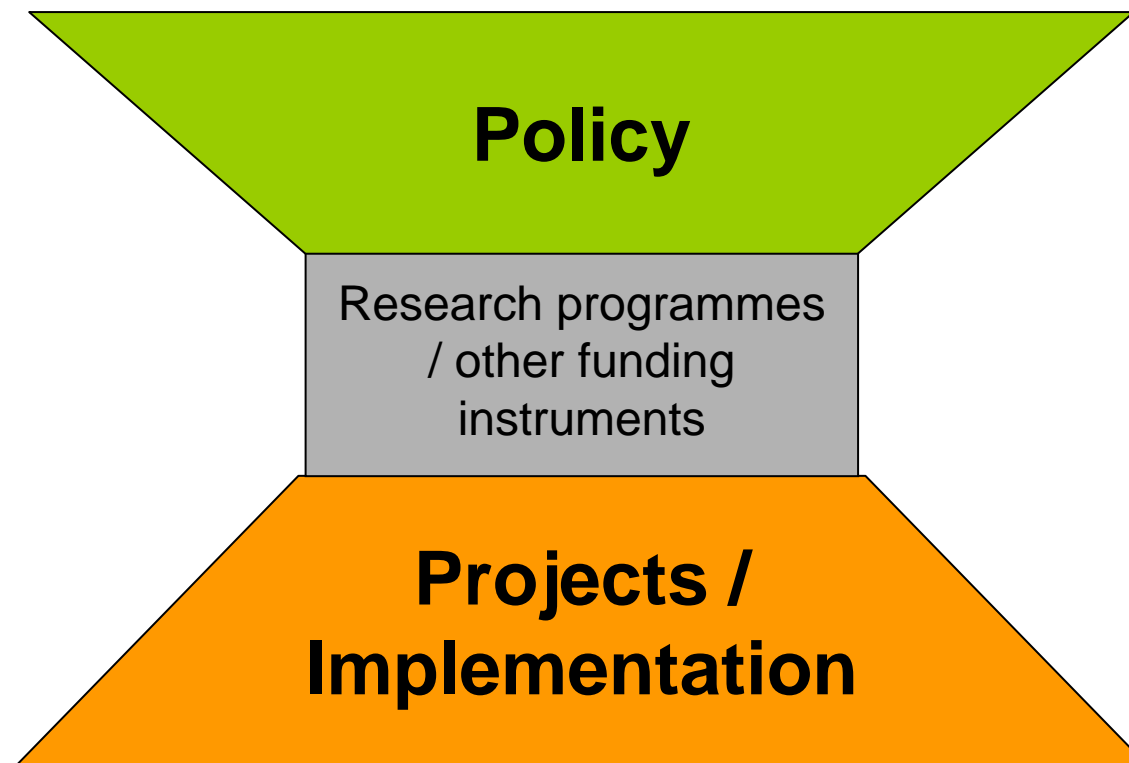

## The Bottleneck Paradox



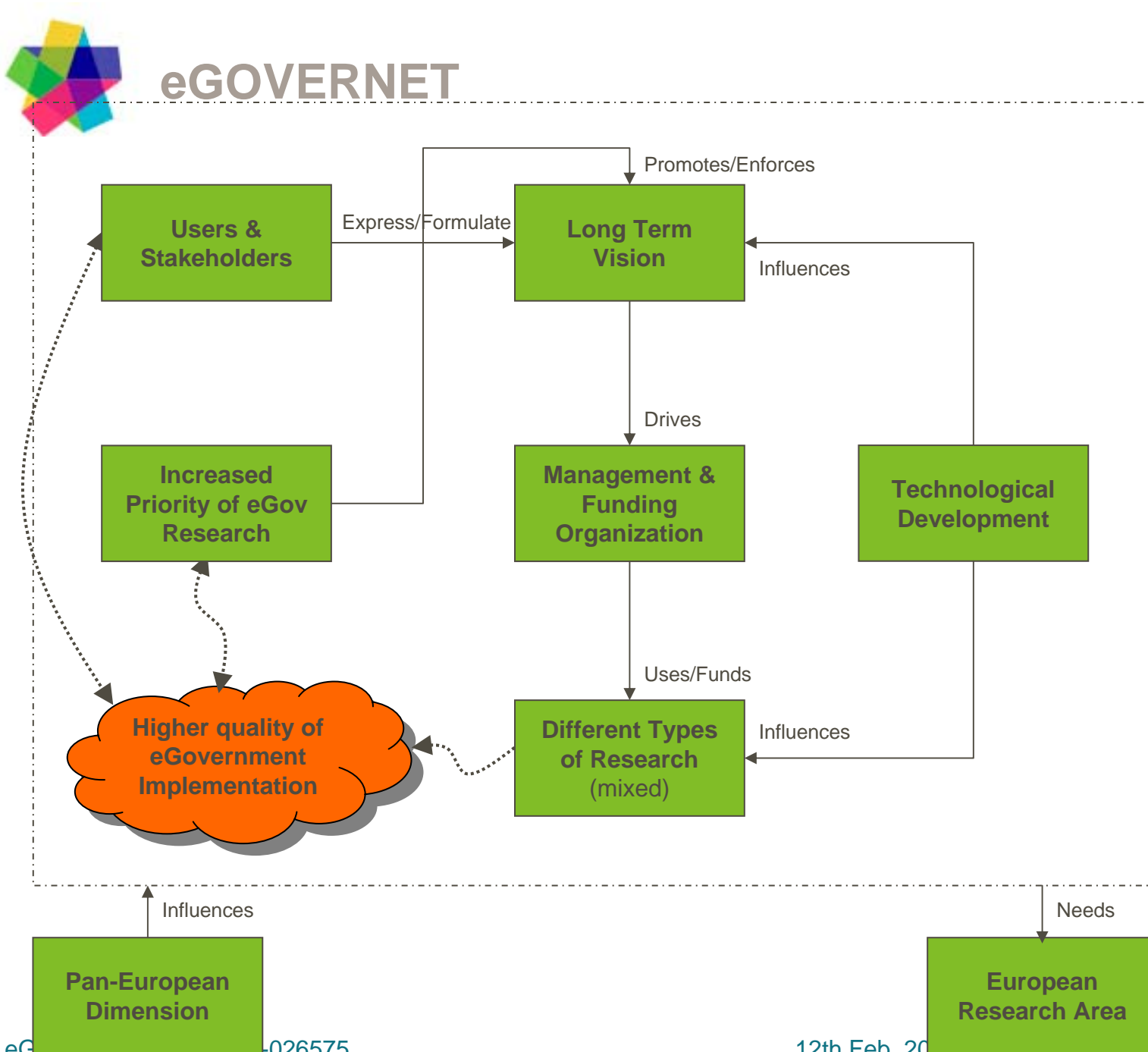
